## About Trainings Early On® Michigan

In order to serve the needs of *Early On*® personnel in Michigan, *Early On* Training & Technical Assistance has developed this annual training schedule. We at EOT&TA want to assist you in planning for specific training needed by your service area. Individuals can go to any of the trainings regardless of their location. All registration will be through EOT&TA. We wish to thank those of you who so willingly let us use your site for this first scheduling venture.

There is a small fee for each of the trainings. Group rates are available.

Michigan State Board of Education Continuing Education Units: SB-CEUs are being applied for, but as of this printing they have not yet been approved for every training. To receive SB-CEUs, full attendance and compliance with attendance verification procedures will be mandatory.

### Additional Training Information:

**IDA** - Every team must have an IDA kit with blank IDA Records, Parent and Health forms, and the manual.

**Procedural Safeguards** - Those who take the entire attendance indicating that they have received training and fulfill the requirement of having trained persons in each service area.

## Registration Information

All participants must register through EOT&TA. This can be accomplished by completing the registration form attached to this brochure. A map to the location of the training will be sent upon confirmation of registration and receipt of payment. A registration form must be completed for each individual and each training. The registration form may be duplicated.

### Fees:

## IDA Training

**Course Description:** 3 days, 9:00 a.m. - 4:00 p.m.  
The IDA is a comprehensive, multidisciplinary, family-centered, infant-toddler evaluation process, which may be used to determine eligibility for *Early On*<sup>®</sup>. The IDA is for professionals from various disciplines who are responsible for assessing the development of infants and toddlers. Each 3-day training series can accommodate twelve two-person teams (24 participants total). Each team will also be responsible for video taping their administration of the IDA and the parent interview to complete the training. Each team must purchase its own IDA kit which includes manuals and assessment materials. Kits may be purchased through Riverside Publishing 1-800-323-9540.

## Procedural Safeguards

**Course Description:** 6 hours, 9:00 a.m. - 4:00 p.m.  
The procedural safeguards required by Part C of IDEA are intended to protect both the interests of families with infants and toddlers with special needs and those of the *Early On* system. Procedural safeguards are the checks and balances of the system, not a piece separate from the system. *Early On* system personnel are legally obligated to explain procedural safeguards to families and to support an active adherence to, and understanding of, these safeguards through the *Early On* system. This training will cover all the requirements of procedural safeguards including: records & confidentiality; notice/native language; consent; administrative resolution of individual hearing issues; and complaint procedures. Vignettes will be studied to aid in problem solving of issues that may occur in practice.

The *Early On* Institute is designed for those new to *Early On*. It is not intended for veterans in the field. Day one will include: History of Part C of IDEA (*Early On*); the Philosophy behind *Early On*; the IFSP Process; Timelines; Eligibility; Referral; Evaluation; Outcomes; Early Intervention Services; and Service Coordination. Day 2 will focus on Procedural Safeguards and how they impact the *Early On* forms and the "Dance of Partnership." Persons registering for the Institute must register for both days.

Creating strategies to use in a child's daily life as well as services needed to support those strategies will be discussed. When possible, parents with children in *Early On* will assist in this training.
