Join us online for 5-10 hours of a self-paced format to learn the basics about identification/child find, referral, service coordination, multi-disciplinary evaluation, individualized family service planning and transition. Learn about family-centered and strength based philosophies, the history of *Early On*, and how to get more information about Part C of IDEIA. Learn about other *Early On* state initiated projects, serving children and families in natural environments, Role Impact Maps for the different positions in *Early On*, and their related Skill Assessments.

Procedural Safeguards

Would you like individualized instructor feedback on-line? Have you been wanting to try on-line coursework? Do you need to meet the requirement for procedural safeguards training in your service area? Then join us for 5-10 hours of *Early On* Procedural Safeguards training. Learn what families and service providers need to know about Part C of IDEIA. Learn about records and confidentiality, notice, native language, consent to services, hearings and mediation, complaint procedures, and disposal of records. Two conference calls will be held for participant discussion and trainer feedback plus there will be homework related to this training! Trainers will be available to provide insight and responses to homework. A certificate will be provided upon completion of this training.

Early On® Training and Technical Assistance (EOT&TA) is a CCRESA Innovative Project funded through the Michigan Department of Education to provide statewide training and technical assistance to *Early On*® Michigan stakeholders. The primary audience is individuals that provide services and service coordination for children, birth to three with special needs, and their families who are eligible for *Early On*® Michigan under Part C of the Individuals with Disabilities Education Improvement Act (IDEIA). In an effort to offer a full continuum of sustained learning opportunities, EOT&TA will add these online trainings to current services noted below:
